- A session, Monday afternoon, on Research & Development.

- A high-powered session, Tuesday morning, on New Business Opportunities.
- European presentations, Tuesday morning, on *fib*'s Approach to High Performance Concrete Structures.
- Importance of Student Education in the Future Growth of the Precast Industry, Tuesday afternoon.
- Innovative Precast, Prestressed Concrete Structures from 2000 PCI Design Awards Program, Wednesday morning.
- As with every PCI Convention, a major highlight is the large Exhibition (76 exhibitors this year) and the Design Awards Banquet.

Orlando, called "The City Beautiful" and "Family Entertainment Capital of the World," is one of the most desirable places to hold a convention. We are fortunate to be headquartered at the luxurious Orlando World Center Marriott. In addition to the magnificent hotel facilities, Orlando offers delightful parks and lakes, superb tennis courts and golf courses, excellent restaurants, and of course, unlimited entertainment – together with sunny weather.
