TONY MAZZEO

Tony J. Mazzeo, former PCI board member, died December 5, 2015. He was 70.

Mazzeo was president of Oldcastle Precast Building Systems division and retired in 2007 after 20 years there. In an Oldcastle newsletter article announcing Mazzeo's retirement, colleagues listed some of his accomplishments. Mazzeo was commended for record performance and growth throughout the late 1990s that culminated in record sales and profits for the Bethlehem, Pa., plant in 2000. As chief operating officer for the Building Systems division, he successfully combined the former Spancrete operations at South Bethlehem, N.Y., and Manchester, N.Y., with the former Strescon operations at Morrisville, Pa., and Baltimore, Md., and the Hatfield, Pa., prestress product facility.

Mazzeo was a member of the PCI Board of Directors in 2001 and 2002. He was also chair of the Housing Market Team from 1999 to 2001 and a member of the Budget Planning and Review Team, the Hollow Core Slab Producers Committee, the Productivity Committee, and the Soundwall Committee.
