

2003 PCI Design Awards Program

The Winning Entries

On June 13, 2003, at the Hyatt Regency O'Hare, Rosemont, Illinois, three jury panels judged 139 entries for the 2003 PCI Design Awards Program.

This program recognizes design excellence in the use of precast, prestressed concrete and/or architectural precast concrete. The annual program is open to all registered architects and engineers practicing professionally or in government agencies in North America. Winners are chosen on the basis of exceptional achievement in aesthetic expression, function and economy, and ingenuity in the use of materials, methods and equipment.

Singled out for recognition were 19 structures comprising ten buildings, eight bridges, and one light rail transit tunnel project. The winning structures were completed within the past three years and constructed in the United States, Canada, or Mexico. This year, three projects received the Harry H. Edwards Industry Advancement Award, which honors "those ideas and concepts that hold the potential to move the industry to the next generation of technology." One of these

winners, the Starz Encore Headquarters in Englewood, Colorado, was also honored as Best All-Precast Solution.

Awardees will receive special recognition at PCI's 49th Annual Convention & Exhibition in Orlando, Florida, during the Design Awards Banquet on Tuesday, October 21. Extensive descriptions of the winning projects appear in the Fall 2003 issue of Ascent Magazine. Winning entries will also receive national publicity through major industry and architectural publications.

PCI traditionally gives all winning projects equal recognition to acknowledge the diversity of design solutions employed by architects and engineers. The PCI JOURNAL has featured articles about several winning entries and will feature more articles in upcoming issues.

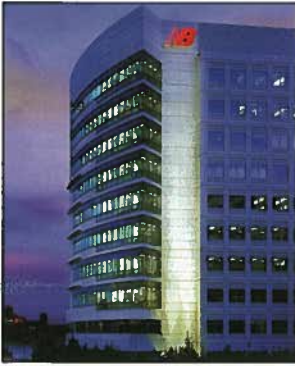

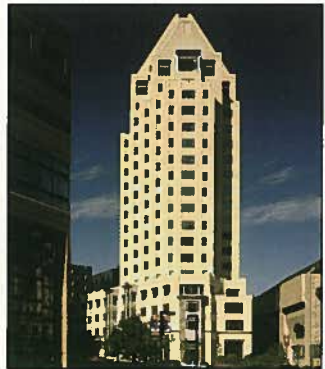

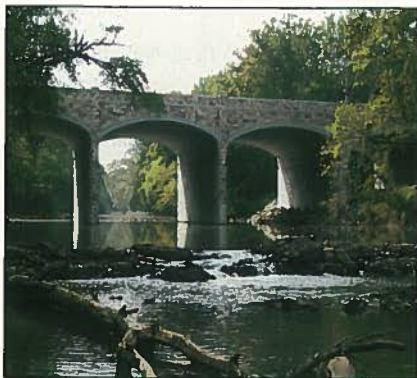
