This one-and-a-half day workshop included proposals for a PCI microsite showcasing the industry to potential workers, interviews from current industry professionals, and plant tours, all as workforce recruitment tools. The goal is to develop a framework of what to expect from PCI at a national level, the PCI regional chapters, and PCI producers and associates. I am excited about this endeavor because I believe that workforce recruitment is the most significant hurdle our industry faces.

As I enter the home stretch as chair, I want to thank the chapter executive directors who have invited me to attend their meetings throughout the country. I have stayed busy traveling and genuinely wish I could attend each and every one. The hospitality and welcome that you have shown me is humbling. The success of PCI depends, now as always, on the individual chapter members and their enthusiasm, support, and investment.
