

Working together to advance precast concrete

PCI recently hosted the annual workshop of the Regional Council at our offices in Chicago, Ill. The council is made up of the executive directors of the local PCI chapters and partner organizations. Logistics wouldn't allow us to have a roadshow of The Concrete Chefs, the PCI Foundation event so wonderfully and generously hosted by Jim Voss and JVI when we are in the Chicago area. Nonetheless, we wanted to keep up the tradition of having an event to benefit the PCI Foundation.

On Thursday night, October 5, immediately following the opening reception, there will be a rock and roll concert to benefit the PCI Foundation performed by The Concrete!, led by our own A. J.
